This form is designed to help you think about the aspects of your event which may involve a level of risk, what accidents could happen and how you help prevent them.

Take your time to think about all possible hazards at your event - anything that could cause harm anyone. It is best to start right at the beginning of the event. Setting up and closing down an event is often more hazardous than the event as the machinery, structures and vehicles arrive and leave the event site.

Then think about, for example, crowd management, cooking equipment and possible fire, animals, moving vehicles or children's amusements like roundabout rides.

Responsibilty for ensuring the safety of those emplyed at, and attending, the event is entirely yours.
