





SPEEDING!

My fun had to stop eventually and down to serious matters! As usual I have been and will continue to be out and about with the speed check device. I receive a lot of complaints about speeding motorists in various places across the Marsh and I see it myself not only when I'm off duty but even when I'm on patrol in the Ranger which is even more frustrating as the Ranger isn't small and stands out but some motorists appear to be in a world of their own and only see me at the last minute, I can always tell when the nose of their vehicle dips forward all of a sudden! Please adhere to the speed limits, whether you agree with them or not they are there for a good reason. I don't think any of us can say that we haven't crept over them from time to time due to lack of concentration or similar but that really shouldn't be any more than a couple of miles an hour over the posted limit, if anything it's better to keep at least a couple of miles an hour under the posted limit, we don't have to be attaining the limit just because the signpost says so and we also have to drive to the road conditions at the time, weather, traffic, pedestrians etc.

In addition to the speed, no mobile phone usage unless its handsfree and even then, it can be a distraction, wear seatbelts because they will save lives, have valid insurance, current MOT and ensure tax is up to date, thank you.

ANOTHER REMINDER ABOUT COLD CALLERS!

Polite reminder about 'cold callers', if you need any work done to your property whether that be roofing, driveways, gardening, decorating or anything that you would like a tradesperson to do, please don't be tempted to employ someone who just turns up unannounced at your front door even if their quote sounds like the bargain of the century! Please try and use a reputable company who YOU contact and not them contacting you out of the blue. I am still seeing residents who use the services of cold callers and enter into a verbal contract (a definite no no) and agreeing on prices without any written contract and if it is a written contract, please read through it checking what your rights are and only signing it when you are 100% happy with everything in it including the total amount of money that you have agreed to pay. If you use a reputable company and have any questions, they will be happy to answer them, there are plenty of excellent local tradespeople across the Marsh who are well established so why would

you use a cold caller who more often than not do not have a local business address, lesson of the day over!

STOP AND SEARCH.

About a week ago a colleague of mine from the Child Centred Policing Team (CCPT) PC Kerry Duncan popped down to the Marsh as she does from time to time and whilst patrolling the area behind the football pavilion in Station Road New Romney, she spoke with three males all of whom were in possession of Cannabis. I attended to assist her in searching the young men under Section 23 Misuse of Drugs Act. The Cannabis was seized from them and will be destroyed, and they will be dealt with accordingly in due course.

The purpose of this message is to warn those Cannabis or any other illegal drug users that you will be stopped and searched if we as police officers have the grounds to do so and if you are in possession of illegal drugs, the consequences for your future could be very damaging, it could lose you your job, restrict your travel to certain countries and if you are stopped whilst driving for whatever reason and have illegal drugs in your system, you could also lose your driving licence. Everyone knows that drink driving is against the law and so is drug driving.

A few days ago I was on mobile patrol across the Marsh and this particular day heading out towards Newchurch along a country lane with beautiful views all around me but then I came across a vehicle parked in a layby, nothing unusual with that of course, I often eat my lunch whilst out and about in my mobile office but this vehicle had a smell of Cannabis emanating from it, anyway, the grounds were met to enable me to search the occupant and the vehicle itself under Section 23 Misuse of Drugs Act whereby I seized an amount of herbal Cannabis and the occupant has been dealt with accordingly and the drugs destroyed.

The message here is, nobody should be in possession of illegal drugs and to have it in your vehicle whereby it could impair your driving is even worse because if it is in your system, you are a danger to everyone else and if caught could lose your licence.

As well as all of the above, I have attended numerous calls, acted on many enquiries and information and submitted intelligence which has either been from my own findings or information received from you, the public, and that's one of the good things about MCV, being able to have that direct contact with me if you want to share some information or are having issues that you need police advice about.
